For the first-ever issue of KEIL's Comfort Zone I would like to rewind history 108 years and relive the events that brought KEIL to where we are today, with such amazing homeowners as yourselves reading this very newsletter.

In 1908 my grandfather Henry Keil founded the company that you know so well today as KEIL Heating and Air Conditioning. Each day, Henry set out on horse-drawn carriage to deliver coal and hygienic ice to homes all along the New Jersey side of the Hudson River so that people could heat their homes and cool their food.

As time passed, Henry upgraded from carriages to the modern trucks of the era. My grandfather added a few more Keil's to the family, with the addition of his sons (my father and uncles) George, Henry and Don. The trio of brothers brought a wave of fresh ideas to KEIL, and we began providing fuel oil to homes that had converted from coal heating.

Water Heater Regulations Changed

3% annual energy savings for homeowners: 100% hassle

On April 16, 2015 the U.S. Department of Energy set new standards for water heaters in the United States. These new water heater regulations are meant to conserve energy on a large scale, but will do little for homeowners year-to-year. The average estimate of savings if you spend \$500 a year on energy used by your water heater is about \$ 15.

Though the changes in individual energy savings are low for these new water heaters, the hassle is high. New water heaters are wider and/or taller than the ones in the past. If your water heater is in a small space built to fit, you will likely have to relocate the new one or downsize to a smaller water heater. There will also be more difficult venting requirements for the new gas water heaters. While the price of these new water heaters is only moderately higher than the old ones, the installation costs could be considerably higher.

Though there are negatives that come with these new regulations there are major large-scale benefits to the environment based on this change! As the U.S. Department of Energy explains: "Standards mandatory in 2015 will save approximately 6 quads of energy and result in approximately \$63 billion in energy bill savings for products shipped from 2015-2044. The standard will avoid about 172.5 million metric tons of carbon dioxide emissions, equivalent to the annual greenhouse gas emissions of about 33.8 million automobiles."

Time for a new water heater? Do not fear. New Jersey's Clean Energy program is offering rebates for the purchase of new high efficiency water heaters , boilers, furnaces and air conditioners. Additionally, you can be assured that with a company like KEIL the process of installing these newly-sized, more energy efficient systems will be stress free for you.

2 cup sifted flour 2 tsp baking powder 1/2 tsp salt 1/4 cup butter 3/4 cup sugar 1 egg beaten 1/2 cup milk 2 cup blueberries



Crumb Topping

1/2 cup sugar

1/4 cup flour

1/2 tsp cinnamon (can use more)

1/4 cup butter

Sift together flour, baking powder and salt. Cream butter. Gradually beat in sugar, add eggs, milk. Beat until smooth. Add dry ingredients, fold in berries.

Spread batter in greased and floured 8x9 inch square pan. Sprinkle with crumb mixture.

Bake in hot oven 375° for 40-45 minutes.

Each month, we search through all major manufacturers websites for bulletins and alerts of any recall notifications. We then run a search through our database of equipment for any matches on recalls. In the event that we find your equipment has been recalled, we will notify you via e-mail of the problem and how it can be fixed. We also work with you and the manufacturer to fix/ replace said product.
